Biography

Paul Kiniery was born January 15, 1900 in Footville, WI. He obtained his bachelor's degree from St. Francis Seminary in Milwaukee in 1924, his M.A. in History in 1926 from the University of Wisconsin and his Ph.D. in history from the same in 1930. He arrived at Loyola University in 1929 as an instructor in the History department. In 1931 he was appointed an associate professor of History at Loyola, where he taught until retiring in 1970. Kiniery served as the assistant dean of the Graduate School from 1931 to 1968.

Scope and Content

The Paul Kiniery, Ph.D., papers comprise .5 linear foot spanning from 1932 to 1940 and include correspondence, lecture notes for courses, manuscripts of book reviews and articles written by Kiniery, and conference materials. Arranged into series.
