# Common Questions

## **Can I use my single accommodation to live in Georgetown?**

No. Students in Georgetown are assigned to the full apartment space. Therefore, no spaces in Georgetown meet a single accommodation. If you are interested in Georgetown, you must choose to forgo your single accommodation to participate in Room Selection. Please note that by forgoing your accommodation, you may end up in a space that does not meet your single accommodation.

## **I have a single accommodation but want a private sleeping space and to live with one person. Do I have options?**

Yes, but spaces are extremely limited. Options are available in Santa Clara Hall and Baumhart Hall 2-bedroom doubles. You will want to make a roommate group with your preferred roommates and ensure your preferences are listed accurately on your application. Our ability to meet such requests is based on our limited availability.

## **I have a single accommodation but want a private sleeping space and to live with two people. Do I have options?**

Yes. Options are available in Messina Hall Suites and Baumhart Hall. You will want to make a roommate group with your preferred roommates and ensure your preferences are listed accurately on your application. Our ability to meet such requests is based on our limited availability.

# Common Questions

## **Do I get priority as a student with accommodations?**

No. You are guaranteed a space that meets your accommodations as long as you meet the appropriate deadlines, or, if you are a junior/senior, guaranteed the ability to select a space that meets your accommodations if your lottery number is low enough to participate in Room Selection. However, your hall or room type preferences may not always be met as they are based on availability.

## **I have a single accommodation but want to live in Baumhart with no roommates, is this an option?**

No. If you preference Baumhart, you will be assigned to a private sleeping space, but you will have a roommate. You are able to “pull-in” a preferred roommate by making a roommate group on the housing application.

## **Can I get an accommodation to live in a quad/quint?**

No. A request to live with a group of roommates in itself is not considered a disability related housing accommodation. It is understandable that you may feel more comfortable when living with individual(s) you are familiar with, but such an accommodation is not reasonable because the University cannot guarantee that your chosen roommate(s) are capable of supporting your disability and it would impose an extra requirement on another student(s).
