Common Questions

Do I need a full group for a quad or a quint?

Yes. You must fill the space to select a quad or a quint. Meaning, you must have a group of 5 for a quint and a group of 4 to select a quad on the Lake Shore Campus. You can select a quad at Baumhart with any size roommate group.

I'm trying to select a room, but I can't see the room type or building I want!

If you can't see the room type or building you want, it is likely no longer available or you do not have the right roommate group size for the space. You should select a backup choice. No new rooms are released during room selection.

I want a single, what are my chances of getting one?

Our single and private sleeping spaces are extremely limited. Many of our singles are not available in general room selection, as most singles are assigned to students with approved disability-related single accommodations through the Student Accessibility Center.

What are my chances of getting [X] building or [X] room type?

It's hard for us to share chances for most room types as student interests change from year to year. Generally, quads and apartment-style spaces at the Lake Shore Campus are very popular and tend to go first.
