General Social Survey (GSS) Open Module Competition 2015, 2017

The GSS fielded the experiment *Interviewers' Ratings of Respondents' Health*, designed by Dana Garbarski, Nora Cate Schaeffer, and Jennifer Dykema. This experiment involves interviewers' ratings of respondents' health for the 2016 and 2018 GSS. This project examines the validity of interviewers' ratings of respondents' general health status with an experiment that varies when in a face-to-face interview the interviewer is asked to rate the respondent's health: at the beginning of the interview before any substantive questions are asked or at the end of interview. Incorporating the interviewer's assessment of the respondent's health might be a cost-effective measure of health to include in surveys and is consistent with the increasing use of interviewers' observations in survey research. This experiment seeks to delineate what factors contribute to interviewers' ratings of respondents' health.
